

UNDERGRADUATE REQUEST TO TAKE GRADUATE-LEVEL COURSE

CNU students in Undergraduate Senior status (90 or more earned credit hours) seeking to enroll in a graduate course must have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher and will be limited to one graduate course (with any associated laboratory) per semester and to an overall total of two graduate courses (with any associated laboratories). The total for these two classes cannot exceed 8 credits. In order to enroll in a second graduate course, the student must earn a grade of B- or better in the first graduate course. Graduate level courses (numbered 500 and above) cannot be taken on a pass/fail basis. If the graduate course is to be used as a substitute course in the major, the student must have the course substitution approved by the appropriate department chair and must attach the Authorization for Course Substitution to this form. Students who are not in senior status **MAY NOT** take graduate-level courses.

Procedure:

- **1.** Complete the information on this form.
- 2. Take this form to the professor of the course that you wish to take for his/her signature.
- 3. Email the completed form to the Office of Graduate Studies at <u>gradstudy@cnu.edu</u> for final approval. If approved, the Office of Graduate Studies will inform you of the approval and will submit your form to the Office of the Registrar to be processed.
- **4.** If approved, let your advisor know about the course change.
